- (a) & (b) No Madam.
- (c) & (d) Mahanagar Telephone Nigam Limited (MTNL) has informed that it has sent a proposal to Bharat Sanchar Nigam Limited (BSNL) for using Millennium Telecom Limited (MTL) as a platform to create Pan India synergy by utilizing resources of both MTNL and BSNL in delivery of ICT (Information & Communications Technology) solutions and for the purpose offered 50% partnership stake in MTL.
- (e) Government is supporting Technology Development in Indian Language (TDIL) Programme to carry out Research and Development in developing cutting edge language technologies and standards.

Under this Programme a project titled "National Roll Out Plan" is being executed through C-DAC (Centre for Development of Advance Computing) wherein language discs containing fonts and localized Bharateeya Libre Office and other software tools have been developed for free distribution in all 22 scheduled languages.

Localised BOSS (Bharat Operating System Solutions) Linux based operating system is also available free of cost for developing multilingual content.
