(a) to (d): In order to ensure fair competition, improved quality of service and equity, Ministry of Information & Broadcasting had sent a reference to Telecom Regulatory Authority of India (TRAI) on 12.12.2012 to examine "Whether any restrictions be imposed on Multi System Operators (MSOs)/ Local Cable Operators (LCOs) to prevent monopolies/ accumulation of interest. If yes, what restrictions should be imposed and what should be the form, nature and scope of such restrictions". TRAI sent its recommendations to the Ministry on 26th November, 2013.
