SECURITY LAPSES AT AIRPORTS

**Will the Minister of CIVIL AVIATION be pleased to state:**

- (a) the total number of cases of security lapses reported at various airports by the Bureau of Civil Aviation Security (BCAS) during the last three years and the current year, airport-wise;
- (b) whether BCAS has made investigations into each of these cases during the said period;
- (c) if so, the details and findings thereof along with the action taken against the defaulters; and
- (d) the steps taken or being taken by BCAS to prevent recurrence of such security lapses at the airports?

Statement in reply to parts (a), (b), (c) & (d) of Lok Sabha Starred (#) Question No. 114 for 01.12.2014 regarding `Security Lapses at Airports`

(a): As per the information provided by Bureau of Civil Aviation Security(BCAS), a total of 29 cases of security lapses has been reported at various airports during the years 2011, 2012, 2013 and 2014 (till October, 2014). The details are as under:-

(b) & (c): The details of lapses and action taken are annexed. BCAS investigates into such lapses on need basis. BCAS brings such security lapses to the notice of the concerned agencies for taking appropriate corrective / remedial action.

(d): BCAS has issued necessary guidelines / instructions from time to time to avoid such lapses. Some of the steps taken to strengthen security arrangements include time bound deployment of CISF at airports, deployment of quick reaction teams at major airports and regular monitoring of security arrangements by inspections and dummy checks.
