Will the Minister of FOOD PROCESSING INDUSTRIES be pleased to state:

- (a) the details of targets set under Vision 2015: Strategy and Action Plan for Food Processing Industries in India;
- (b) whether the targets set under the said Vision have been achieved;
- (c) if so, the details thereof;
- (d) whether there is any proposal to revise the Vision Document in view of the changing scenario in the food processing sector; and
- (e) if so, the details thereof?

Answer

THE MINISTER OF STATE FOR FOOD PROCESSING INDUSTRIES (SADHVI NIRANJAN JYOTI)

(a) to (c): In order to promote food processing industries, increase level of processing and exploit the potential of domestic and international market for processed food products, Vision Document 2015 was prepared by the Ministry, which envisaged trebling the size of investment in the processed food sector by increasing the level of processing of perishables from 6% to 20%, value addition from 20% to 35% and share in global food trade from 1.5% to 3% by 2015. To achieve these targets, an investment of Rs. 100,000 crore was required by the year 2015. Out of which, the share of Government was Rs.10,000 crore.

During the 11th Five Year Plan, against the proposal for allocation of Rs. 4816 crore for the Ministry, a plan outlay of Rs. 4041 crore only was made for various programmes / schemes of the Ministry. However, the budget allocation for implementing the various schemes of the Ministry of Food Processing Industries during the 11th Plan was Rs.1672 crore. The actual expenditure incurred was Rs. 1596.88 crore only.

During the 12th Five Year Plan, against the proposal for allocation of Rs. 14604 crore for the Ministry, a plan outlay of Rs. 5990 crore only was made for various programmes / schemes of the Ministry. However, the budget allocation for implementing the various schemes of the Ministry of Food Processing Industries during the 12th Plan was Rs.1810 crore. The actual expenditure incurred so far is Rs. 1721.12 crore only.
