- (a) whether the Government has launched schemes for prevention of Malaria in the country including Maharashtra;
- (b) if so, the details thereof along with the funds allocated for these schemes during the last three years and the current year; and
- (c) the progress made in reducing the Malaria cases in the country including Maharashtra?

**Answer**

THE MINISTER OF HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE (SHRI JAGAT PRAKASH NADDA)

(a): National Vector Borne Disease Control Programme is an ongoing national health programme being implemented throughout the country including State of Maharashtra for prevention and control of all vector borne diseases including malaria.

(b): Funds allocated for implementation of NVBDCP during last three years and current year is given below:

(c): Incidence as per reported cases of malaria has decreased from 1.31 million in 2011 to around 1 million cases during the last three years in the country as shown below:

Similarly incidence of malaria in the State of Maharashtra has decreased from 96.6 thousand in 2011 to below 60 thousand during last three years as indicated below:
