(a) & (b): Environment is a subject which is beyond the domains of boundaries of particular State. In conformity with the vision, mission and objectives of the Government for protection of environment, various schemes and projects supported by legislative, administrative and regulatory measures are being implemented including through the Ministry of Environment, Forest & Climate Change and its attached offices, autonomous organizations and other bodies as also State Departments of Environment and Forest, and State Pollution Control Boards/ Pollution Control Committees. To improve upon the intermediate output and final outcomes from their utilization as well as supplementing of Plan funds, the Ministry has also undertaken a number of reform measures and policy initiatives which include public private partnership, alternate delivery mechanism, social and gender empower- ment process. For discharging its functional responsibilities, the Ministry has created suitable institutional infrastructure at the national, regional, and State level in the form of six Regional Offices, National Biodiversity Authority, Central Zoo Authority, Wildlife Crime Control Bureau, National Tiger Conservation Authority, Animal Welfare Board of India, Central Pollution Control Board, and various environmental research institutions/ organizations, etc. The Ministry also provides funding to various States and Union Territories, including Jharkhand, under various Central Sector Schemes and also Centrally Sponsored Schemes covered under Central Assistance to State Plans.

The details of the Plan funds released to Jharkhand, under some important Centrally Sponsored Schemes for protection of the environment during the last three years and current year so far are as under:
