(a)&(b): The production of coal in the country falls short of the overall demand for coal from various sectors including the power sector. The grade-wise production of coal during 2013-14 is given in the table.

(c): The production of coal from open cast and underground mines during the year 2013-14 was 516.12 Mte and 49.65 Mte respectively with the share being 91.2% and 8.8% respectively.

(d): The stepsenvisaged by CIL / SCCL to increase coal production from underground mines include: (i) Deployment of Mass Production Technology i.e. use of Continuous Miner in Board & Pillar working and adopting Long Wall Technology at suitable locale where geo-mining conditions permit (ii) Installation of man riding system particularly in arduous/long travelling road mines of CIL to improve effective working hours of underground mines (iii) Up gradation of technology presently in practice in CIL mines including UG mines and further modernization.
