(a) & (b): Since, Industry is a State subject, hence no centralized data is maintained in this department for heavy industries set up in various parts of country.

The detail of turnover and profit and loss during last three financial years of Central Public Sector Enterprises (CPSEs) including CPSEs administered by the Department of Heavy Industry (DHI) is available in Statement no. 15 & 3 of Volume I of Public Enterprises Survey 2012-13 already laid on the Table of the both Houses of Parliament on 20th February, 2014.

(c): No Madam. However, Department of Heavy Industry (DHI), Ministry of Heavy Industries & Public Enterprises is concerned with three industrial sectors viz. Heavy Electrical Engineering Industry, Heavy Engineering Equipment & Machine Tools Industry and Automotive Industry. For development of these sectors, Ministry has formulated Automotive Mission Plan, National Electric Mobility Mission Plan 2020, Electrical Equipment Industry Mission Plan, Capital Goods Scheme.
