(a) the details of enrolment in primary and middle schools in the country during the last three years and the current year, State-wise;

(b) whether in some States, primary school enrolment has fallen in the current year as compared to the previous year;

(c) if so, the details thereof along with the reasons for this fall in enrolment;

(d) the steps taken to improve the enrolment of children;

(e) whether the Union Government has sought a report from the State Government in this regard and if so, the details thereof; and

(f) the details of funds allocated for primary, secondary and senior secondary schools in rural areas during the last three years, yearwise?

Answer

MINISTER OF HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT (SMT. SMRITI ZUBIN IRANI)

(a) to (c): As per Unified District Information System for Education (UDISE), the statement showing the State- wise details on enrolment of children at primary and upper primary level during 2011-12, 2012-13 & 2013-14 is at Annexure. The reason for decrease in enrolment at primary level is mainly due to reduction in child population.

(d) to (f): Adequate school infrastructure, dist- ribution of free uniform, textbooks, sanction of additional teacher posts, teacher training, special training for out of school children, transports/ escort facilities, opening of KGBVs, provision for CWSN children, Mid-day-Meal etc., are being provided to improve the enrolment of children at elementary education level. During 2011-12, 2012-13 & 2013-14, Rs. 2077538.33 lakh, Rs. 2383655.62 lakh & Rs.2473509.82 lakh were released under SSA prog- ramme and Rs. 249590.18 lakh, Rs.316283.89 lakh & Rs. 304096.06 lakh were released under Rashtriya Madhyamik Shiksha Abhiyan (RMSA) programme to improve access & quality in secondary education, during the above period.
