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Will the Minister of HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the food served in Navodaya Vidyalayas in the country is found to be not of good quality and if so, the details thereof;
- (b) whether the Government has decided to get people from the hospitality sector to train wardens and cooks at Navodaya Vidyalayas and if so, the details thereof:
- (c) whether the Government has consulted States for this purpose and if so, the response of the State Governments thereto;
- (d) whether the Government has also made training mandatory for new principals and if so, the details thereof; and
- (e) the other steps taken/being taken by the Government to induct quality teachers and principals in Government schools?

Answer

- (a) No, Madam.
- (b) Catering Assistants, Cooks and Mess Helpers in Jawahar Navodaya Vidyalayas are provided regular training to improve their competency. Such training has been provided through Institutes of Hotel Mana- gement & Catering Technology at Chandigarh, Bhopal, Lucknow, Hyderabad etc. Training is also provided in Jawahar Navodaya Vidyalayas (JNVs) by inviting experts from such institutes.
- (c) State Governments were consulted and are imp- lementing training of Cooks-cum-helpers under the Mid day Meal Scheme with the help of Institutes of Hotel Management and nutrition experts.
- (d) All newly appointed Principals of the JNVs are required to undergo three weeks mandatory induction programme immediately after their joining. Thereafter, all the Principals also attend regular in-service training programmes in relevant areas to enable them to perform their duties effectively.
- (e) The teachers and Principals in Jawahar Navodaya Vidyalayas (JNVs) are selected after thorough scree- ning on the basis of an open competitive examination/ limited departmental examination/interview. Possession of a teaching degree i.e. B.Ed. from a recognized institute is compulsory for appointment as a teacher or Principal in JNVs. Trained Graduate Teachers are also required to qualify Central Teacher Eligibility Test (CTET) conducted by the Central Board of Secondary Education (CBSE) before their appointment.
