SHORTAGE OF TEACHERS IN KVS

Will the Minister of HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT be pleased to state:

- (a) whether teaching in Kendriya Vidyalayas (KVs) in the country particularly in Bihar has been affected owing to shortage of permanent teachers during the last five years;
- (b) if so, the number of vacancies of permanent teachers, State/school-wise; and
- (c) the steps taken/proposed to be taken by the Government to fill up the vacant posts in Kendriya Vidyalayas particularly in Bihar at the earliest?

Answer

MINISTER OF HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT (SMT. SMRITI ZUBIN IRANI)

(a) No, Madam. Kendriya Vidyalayas (KVs) engage teachers on contract basis whenever the regular teachers for any subject are not available, so that the studies of students are not affected adversely. The academic performance of the students of KVs including those in Bihar (Patna Region) has continuously been very good as per the details given in the table below:-

(c) The recruitment of regular teachers in KVs is a continuous process. As per standing instructions from KVS, the principals are authorized to appoint qualified teachers on contractual basis against the vacancies available in their respective Vidyalayas to mitigate the shortage of staff till regular teachers are appointed.
