- (b) if so, the details regarding recent launches by India and the expenses incurred thereon;
- (c) whether the GLSV Mark III launch also cost India more due to lack of facilities in the country;
- (d) if so, the details thereof;
- (e) whether the cryogenic engine for the upper stage for the Mark III is still being developed; and
- (f) if so, the details thereof?

- (a) No Madam. GSAT-16 satellite was launched from abroad through a commercial contract.
- (b) During the last 18 months, GSAT-16, a communication satellite weighing 3180 kg was launched onboard Ariane-5 launch vehicle on December 07, 2014 from Kourou, French Guinea, through a commercial launch contract. The expense incurred towards the launch is about US \$ 88.26 Million.
- (c) &(d) No Madam. Facilities required for the development and operationalisation of GSLV Mark III Launch vehicle are established in the country.
- (e) Yes Madam.
- (f) A high thrust cryogenic engine for the upper stage for the GSLV Mark III is under development. It has successfully undergone two short duration ignition trials at the ISRO Propulsion Complex, Mahendragiri and other developmental tests are in progress.
