Will the Minister of RURAL DEVELOPMENT be pleased to state:

(a) whether the State can be listed in the order of their performance in implementing rural development schemes;

(b) if so, the details thereof;

(c) whether there is any scheme of reward and punishment for the States for their performances;

(d) if so, the details thereof and action generally taken against non-performing States: and

(e) if not, the reasons therefor?

Answer

MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF RURAL DEVELOPMENT (SHRI SUDARSHAN BHAGAT)

(a) & (b): No methodology has been evolved for grading the States/UTs in order of their overall performance in implementing rural development schemes. However, under Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Act (MGNREGA), the performance of various States/UTs can be assessed on parameters such as - persondays created, average persondays of work provided per household, percentage of households completing 100 days, percentage of work done on convergence, percentage of works completed, percentage of SC/ST job card holders provided work and percentage of payments made on time.

(c) to (e): The Ministry awards the states for better implementation of MGNREGA under different categories. For the financial year 2013-14 the following three States have awarded for effective implementation of activities under MGNREGA under the category mentioned against them:

(i) Andaman & Nicobar Islands - Social inclusion.

(ii) Madhya Pradesh - Sustainable Livelihood through Convergence

(iii) Sikkim - Transparency and Accountability.

Besides, the Ministry has developed a system of monitoring the implementation of the programmes including utilization of funds through Periodical Progress Reports, Performance Review Committee, Area Officer's Scheme, Vigilance and Monitoring Committee at the State/District Level, and National Level Monitors.
