(a) to (c) The activities of the Indian Council for Cultural Relations (ICCR), which is mandated to promote international understanding through culture also includes organizing of visits by foreign artists to India. Consistent with the vision to build peaceful and friendly bilateral ties with Pakistan, as enshrined in the Simla Agreement (1972), Government has also been encouraging cultural exchanges between India and Pakistan. Several visits to India by Pakistani artists take place every year which are being organized by private individuals and organizations.

Travel of Pakistani artists to India is always governed by the rules under the existing India-Pakistan visa regime.
