Will the Minister of HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the Government has revised the duration of B.Ed. course from one year to two year from the next academic year;
- (b) if so, the details thereof and the reason therefor;
- (c) whether the said decision of the Government has increased the financial burden on the students; and
- (d) if so, the details thereof and the steps taken by the Government to reduce the financial burden of students particularly weaker sections?

Answer

(a) to (d): The NCTE had revised its existing Regulations with the new Regulations viz. National Council for Teacher Education (Recognition Norms & Procedure) Regulations 2014 stipulating the requirements for grant of recognition of various teacher education course/ increase of intake in existing recognized Teacher Education Institutions notified in the Gazette of India on1st December, 2014.

The B.Ed. course has been made a two year program to make it more rigorous and professionalized. The course curriculum has a strong component of Internship and school practicum now.

The fee to be charged by teacher education institutions is decided by a committee set up at State Government level under the chairmanship of Education Secretary as per NCTE Fee Regulations, 2002; amended vide Notification, 2010.
