Will the Minister of TOURISM be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the Government has mooted a proposal for Mega tourism projects to promote tourism in the country;
- (b) if so, the details thereof;
- (c) the details of such projects allocated to various States in the country including Uttar Pradesh along with the new tourist places identified for promotion of tourism in the country;
- (d) the time by which such tourist spots are likely to be brought under the tourism map;
- (e) whether some of these projects are pending due to lack of funds; and
- (f) if so, the details thereof and the action taken by the Government in this regard?

Answer

MINISTER OF STATE FOR TOURISM (INDEPENDENT CHARGE) (DR. MAHESH SHARMA)

(a) to (f): Ministry of Tourism (MOT) had a scheme for providing Central Financial Assis- tance (CFA) up to an amount of Rs.25.00 crore for Mega Destinations and Rs.50.00 crore for Mega Circuits respectively, under Centrally Sponsored Scheme viz. Project/Infrastructure Development for Destinations and Circuits (PIDDC) to various State Governments and Union Territory Administrations, prioritized in consultation with them, as per the Scheme Guidelines, inter-se priority, liquidation of pending utilization certificates against the funds released earlier and adherence to the scheme guidelines.

The State/UT-wise list of Mega destinations/ circuits sanctioned/identified, funds allo- cated and amount released till 31.12.2014 including for the State of Uttar Pradesh is given at Annexure-I.

For the current financial year 2015-16, no provision is available for States under the PIDDC. However, a budget provision of Rs.600.00 crore and Rs.100.00 crore respectively is available for the new schemes Swadesh Darshan & National Mission on Pilgrimage Rejuvenation and Spiritual Augmentation Drive (PRASAD) launched by the Ministry of Tourism:

Under Swadesh Darshan for Integrated Deve- lopment of Tourist Circuits around Specific Themes. The following five circuits have been identified for development:-

- (i) North East Circuit
- (ii) Buddhist Circuit
- (iii) Himalayan Circuit
- (iv) Coastal Circuit
- (v) Krishna Circuit

Under PRASAD, initially twelve cities have been identified namely Ajmer, Amritsar, Amravati, Dwarka, Gaya, Kedarnath, Kamakhaya, Kanchipuram, Mathura, Puri, Vara- nasi and Velankanni.

The details of projects sanctioned under these new schemes are given in Annexure II.
