(f) whether the Government has takenany initiatives to improve the quality ofsilk being produced in the country, if so,the details thereof?

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(b):The basic customs duty on imported Raw silk was reduced from 30% in 2010-11 to5% in 2011-12. Even since the duty structure has been as below:-

(f): Yes, Madam. The Government has taken the following measures to improve the quality of silk produced in the country:-

Production of Import substitute Bivoltine (BV) and Improved Cross Breed (ICB) Silks adopting cluster approach & promoting use of high-end technology. The activities of cocoon production, reeling & weaving are clustered and linkages are strengthened between the producers and industry at all level. Large scale processing units such as fully Automatic Reeling units are established with a view to produce international quality raw silk of uniform grade.

Under XII Plan, 176 clusters have been organized under Cluster Promotion Programme (CPP) to augment the production of bivoltine silk production in the country.

Automatic reeling units are set up in the country for production of 3A-4A grade raw silk from bivoltine hybrid cocoons

Government through Central Silk Board is implementing Catalytic Development Programme (CDP) in association with State Governments in a package-mode to improve the facilities and make the farmers, reelers and weavers to adopt the modern technologies with the aim to increase productivity and quality of silk produced in the country.

Under CDP, incentives are provided for reelers for the production of quality bivoltine silk (Rs.150 per kg for 2A grade and above silk and Rs. 100 per kg for other gradable silks below 2A grade).
