(c) other steps initiated by the Government particularly in Bihar to restructuring the transport facility in the said areas?

(a)& (b):Government has approved a Road Requirement Plan (RRP) in 2009 for improvement of road connectivity in Left Wing Extremism (LWE) affected areas of 34 Districts in 8 States covering 5477 km length (1126 km NHs & 4351 km State Roads]. The details are enclosed in Annexure.

(c):Other Steps:

(i) Pradhan Mantri Gram SadakYojana (PMGSY) is a one-time special intervention of Government of India to provide connectivity in rural areas by way of a single All-Weather road, to the eligible unconnected habitations as per Core-Network. The fund released and expenditure incurred during the last three years and current year for the state of Bihar is given below:
