(b):Presently, India is exporting Grapes to 112 Countries. However, the major percentage of export is being made to countries like Bangladesh, Netherlands and UAE. The details of export to countries is given at Annexure-I.

(c):Under the Centrally Sponsored Scheme "Mission for Integrated Development of Horticulture", the assistance of Rs.1.60 lakh/ha. (40% of cost i.e. Rs.4.00 lakh/ha.) is given for meeting the expenditure on planting material and cost of material for drip irrigation, trellis and Integrated Nutrient Management/ Integrated Pest Management, in 3 installments of 60:20:20 subject to survival rate of 75% in 2nd year and 90% in 3rd Year for Integrated package with drip irrigation and trellis.

The assistance of Rs.0.50 lakh/ha. (40% of cost i.e. Rs.1.25 lakh/ha.) is given for meeting the expenditure on planting material and Integrated Nutrient Management/ Integrated Pest Management, in 3 installments of 60:20:20 subject to survival rate of 75% in 2nd year and 90% in 3rd Year for without integration of drip & trellis.
