(a) & (b): Yes, Madam. The University Grants Commission (UGC) has informed that it is implementing the schemes of Community Colleges and B.Voc. Degree Programme for skill development of youth in various sectors, including in Interior Design, across the country. The students can opt for a certificate, Diploma, Advance Diploma or a B.Voc. Degree Programme from any Institution approved by the UGC for offering such programmes. The Universities/ Colle- ges approved by the UGC, under its scheme of Community Colleges and B.Voc. Degree programme, for imparting skill based education and training in the field of Interior Design, are the following:

(c) & (d): The Bachelor of Vocation (B.Voc.) is a degree specified under section 22(3) of UGC Act 1956 and notified in the Gazette of India on 14th December, 2012. The degree enables the candidate vertical mobility for post graduation and research in concerned specialization. The Commission has recommended, in its 506th meeting, held on 3rd February, 2015, specification of M.Voc. degree in the list of degrees under Section 22(3) of the UGC Act, 1956.
