(a) & (b): As per information provided by PanIIT Alumni India, (Apex body having all IIT Associations in India as its members), IIT Bombay Alumni Association (IITBAA) has set up an IITBAA Global Business Forum to showcase technology solutions, research and products developed by alumni, faculty and students of IIT Bombay. The Forum seeks to bring together leaders in governments, businesses as well as potential inve- stors, trade organisations for mutually beneficial collaborations.

(d) & (e): The revised Centrally Sponsored Scheme 'Vocationalisation of Secondary and Higher Secondary Education (VS&HSE)', a component of Inte- grated Rashtriya Madhyamik Shiksha Abhiyan (RMSA) envisages imparting vocational education in classes 9th to 12th in Government, Government aided and recognised private schools. The Scheme has so far covered 3645 government schools in 30 States/UTs across various sectors. The Scheme is fully compliant with the National Skills Qualifications Framework. The objective of the Scheme is to enhance employability of youth and maintain their competitiveness by providing them with multi-entry, multi-exit learning opportunities and vertical mobility/ inter-changeability in qualifications.
