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Will the Minister of HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the Government has decided to make yoga mandatory in all Central Government run schools including Kendriya Vidyalayas and Jawahar Navodaya Vidyalayas in the country;
- (b) if so, the details thereof;
- (c) whether the Government has released course material and syllabus for yoga designed by National Council for Educational Research and Training (NCERT) for classes VI to X and if so, the details thereof;
- (d) whether the Government has also developed training module on yoga under teacher education programme and if so, the details thereof; and
- (e) the other steps taken/being taken by the Government to strictly enforce imparting of yoga by trained teachers in these schools?

Answer

- (a) & (b) Yoga is not a compulsory subject in Kendriya Vidyalayas (KVs) and Jawahar Navodaya Vidyalayas (JNVs). However, Yoga is taken up as a part of sports and physical activity in these schools.
- (c) Syllabus on Yoga from Upper Primary to Secondary Stage has been developed by NCERT and two books on Yoga for Upper Primary (VI to VIII) and Secondary Stages (IX & X) were released during celebration of International Yoga Day.
- (d) & (e) NCTE has also developed modules on Yoga Education for Diploma in Elementary Education, Bachelor of Education and Master of Education Programmes. Yoga Education has been made a compulsory area of study and practice by all teacher educators and would-be teachers (student-teachers).
