LNG TERMINALS

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Will the Minister of PETROLEUM AND NATURAL GAS be pleased to state:

- (a) the existing number of Liquefied Natural Gas (LNG) terminals in the country, State-wise;
- (b) the status of production and capacity utilisation of existing LNG terminals, State-wise including Kerala;
- (c) whether the Government proposes to develop/expand more such terminals in the country;
- (d) if so, the details thereof along with the proposals, if any, received from the States particularly Andhra Pradesh and Kerala in this regard, Location-wise; and
- (e) the action taken by the Government in this regard?

Answer

(a) & (b): At present there are four LNG terminals in the country. State wise details of existing Liquefied Natural Gas (LNG) Terminals along with their installed capacity and that utilized is as under:

State	Terminal	Installed Capacity (in MMTPA)	Capacity utilization in 2013-14 (in %)
Gujarat	Dahej	10	100
Gujarat	Hazira	5	56.4
Kerala	Kochi	5	1-5
Maharashtra	Dabhol	5	8.3

(c) to (e): Decision to set up LNG Terminals is taken by companies based on techno commercial considerations.
