- (a) The details for the year 2011-2012, 2012-2013 and 2013-2014 are given at Annexure 'A'. Actuals for the year 2014-2015 have not yet been finalized.
- (b) (i) An Expenditure Management Commission has been constituted by the Ministry of Finance vide Resolution dated 4th September, 2014 with the following Terms of Reference:
- 1. Review the major areas of Central Government expenditure, and to suggest ways of creating fiscal space required to meet developmental expenditure needs, without compromising the commitment to fiscal discipline; : 2:
- 2. Review the institutional arrangement, including budgeting process and FRBM rules, for enforcing aggregate fiscal discipline and suggest improvement therein;
- 3. Suggest measures to improve allocating efficiencies in the existing expenditure classification system, including focus on capital expenditure;
- 4. Design a framework to improve operational efficiency of expenditure through focus on utilization, targets and outcomes;
- 5. Suggest an effective strategy for meeting reasonable proportion of expenditure on services through user charges;
- 6. Suggest measures to achieve reduction in financial costs through better Cash Management System;
- 7. Suggest greater use of IT tools for expenditure management;
- 8. Suggest improved financial reporting systems in terms of accounting, budgeting, etc., and;
- 9. Consider any other relevant issue concerning Public Expenditure Management in Central Government and make suitable recommendations.
- (ii) Administrative efficacy is being improved with better and increased implementation of Direct Benefit Transfer (DBT), better targeting, review of schemes through monitoring, Public Finance Management System(PFMS), etc.
