Will the Minister of LABOUR AND EMPLOYMENT be pleased to state:

- (a) whether hospitals run by Employees State Insurance Corporation (ESIC) in the country including in Karnataka are facing a significant shortage of doctors and specialists;
- (b) if so, the details of the sanctioned strength and vacancies of doctors and specialists since 2010, State/year-wise;
- (c) the reasons for the shortage of medical personnel; and
- (d) whether the Government is planning to revise recruitment regulations in consultation with ESIC and if so, the details thereof?

(a): Details of vacancy position of Doctors (GDMO) and Specialists in Employees' State Insurance Corporation (ESIC) including Karnataka are as under:

Filling up of vacancies is an on-going process. 84 offers of appointments to Doctors (GDMOs) have been issued.

- (b): State-wise details of sanctioned strength and vacancies of doctors and specialists are at Annex I, II & III.
- (c): The main reasons for shortfall of doctors/specialists include:
- 1. General shortage of doctors particularly in the specialists in the country.
- 2. Some doctors/specialists do not apply for the job as private practice is not allowed in ESI Corporation.
- 3. Doctors leave the job for better opportunity outside ESI Corporation or for pursuing higher studies.
- (d): At present no proposal for revision of Recruitment Regulations of Doctors/Specialists is under consideration.
