- (e) the time by which these corridors are likely to be completed, corridor-wise?

STATEMENT REFERRED TO IN REPLY TO PARTS (A) TO (E) OF THE LOK SABHA STARRED QUESTION NO.130FOR 29.7.2015 REGARDING REGIONAL RAPID TRANSIT SYSTEM

- (a): The Feasibility Reports of the following three prioritized Regional Rapid Transit System (RRTS) corridors have been prepared:
- (i) Delhi-Gurgaon-Rewari-Alwar: 180 km
- (ii) Delhi-Ghaziabad-Meerut: 90 km
- (iii) Delhi-Sonepat-Panipat: 111 km
- (b): The RRTS projects will be implemented by a Special Purpose Vehicle (SPV) namely, National Capital Region Transport Corporation (NCRTC).
- (c): The funding pattern for implementation of the individual RRTS project has not been decided as the corridors have not been sanctioned.
- (d): The likely benefits from the RRTS Corridorsarequantifiable benefits such as fuel savings, travel time savings, savings in capital expenditure onroad vehicles and non-quantifiable benefits such as economic development in the region, transit oriented urban planning, better access to workplaces and other amenities, improved comfort to passengers, reduction in pollution, reduction in road accidents, savings in vehicular operating costs, etc.
- (e): Since the individual corridors have not yet been sanctioned, the expected time for completion can not be projected.
