STATEMENT AS REFERRED TO IN REPLY TO PARTS (a) to (d) OF THE LOK SABHA STARRED QUESTION NO 180 TO BE ANSWERED ON 31.7.2015

(a) to (d): The Government has proposed to declare the Film & Television Institute of India, Pune and Satyajit Ray Film & Television Institute, Kolkata to be the Institutions of national importance through the proposed 'The National Institutes of Film, Television and Allied Studies Bill, 2014'. However, the Ministry of HRD is examining the proposal to include all such Institutes proposed to be declared as "Institute Of National Importance" by various Ministries / Departments under the existing Central Universities Act 2009. Either of the proposed legislative framework would provide greater autonomy and independence for the Institute.
