Will the Minister of FINANCE be pleased to state:

- (a) the number of sick cement industries in the country at present, State- wise along with the total losses accumulated by these industries; and
- (b) the measures taken by the Government to revive the said cement industries?

Answer

MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF FINANCE (SHRI JAYANT SINHA)

- (a): The number of medium and large sick cement industries under the purview of Board for Industrial and Financial Reconstruction (BIFR) in the country at present, is at Annexure. There is no separate data which is maintained for Micro and Small Enterprises (MSEs) with respect to sick cement units. However, as per Reserve Bank of India (RBI), there were 456771 sick SSI/MSE units financed by Scheduled Commercial Banks as on 15th September 2014.
- (b): With a view to secure the timely detection of sick and potential sick companies and for their possible revival/ rehabilitation, through Financial Reconstruction, BIFR, a Quasi-Judicial body under the Sick Industrial Companies (Special Provisions) Act, 1985 (SICA) was constituted.

Towards revival and rehabilitation of a sick company, registered with the BIFR, the BIFR recommends:

- (a) Financial reconstruction
- (b) Change in management of sick company
- (c) Amalgamation with other company
- (d) Sale or lease of part of or whole of sick company
- (e) Such other preventive ameliorative and remedial measures as may be appropriate.

Ministry of Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises has on 29th May 2015 notified the framework for revival and rehabilitation of Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises wherein banks/creditors are required to identify incipient stress and a Committee consisting of representatives of banks, State Government and Independent experts will formulate a Corrective Action Plan for the revival of the unit.
