- (b) whether the Government has any proposal to make a distinction between use of wildlife for 'Cultural and Religious Practices' and hunting and if so, the details thereof;
- (c) whether a list, sanctioning cultural activities that warrant wildlife use, has been prepared and if so, the details thereof; and
- (d) whether a list of animals, which can be killed or captured for Cultural and Religious reasons has been prepared and if so, the details thereof?

(a) and (b) The Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change has received representations from peoples' representatives and citizens for consideration of granting permission for capture of snakes during the festival of 'Nagpanchami'. This involves amendment to the provisions of Wild Life (Protection) Act, 1972 which is underway. No final decision for use of wildlife for cultural and religious practices and for 'hunting' has been taken in the Ministry.
