(a) & (b): Yes, Madam. Allahabad Museum, Allahabad and Salar Jung Museum, Hyderabad encourage budding artistes by exhibiting their work without any charges. Lalit Kala Akademi gives its galleries on rent to individuals and group of artists on nominal rates as it is the Akademi's mandate to promote visual arts of the country. Lalit Kala Akademi has art galleries at Chennai, Lucknow, Bhubaneswar, Shimla and New Delhi. Out of its two galleries at New Delhi, Indira Gandhi National Centre for the Arts (IGNCA) also gives one gallery to students of NIFT, Schools of Art etc. at low rates. In addition, Indian Museum, Kolkata, National Gallery of Modern Art (New Delhi, Mumbai, and Bangalore), National Museum and Victoria Memorial Hall, Kolkatta also have art galleries.

(c) & (d) : Lalit Kala Akademi plans to open an art gallery in its new complex to be developed at Kolkata on the land allotted by the State Government.
