- (c) & (d): Under the Agreement signed with Israel and Netherlands, Centre of Excellences in the area of horticulture have been established in various States for demonstration, dissemination of information and imparting training to field officers and farmers. A Project for implementation of various interventions including Minor Irrigation Development for Crop Diversification in Himachal Pradesh was signed in 2010 with Japan International Cooperation Agency (JICA).
- (e): The benefits accrued / likely to accrue are in the form of training and visiting facilities in respective countries, visit of farmers and farmer organization, higher education in agriculture in other countries, training and demonstration, etc. in the agriculture sector, enhancement of mutual exchange of knowledge, transfer of appropriate technologies, equipment, genetic material, research and capacity building and skill development programs for the development of the agricultural sector.
