(e) whether the Government has studied the impact of vocational courses in the present set up during the last one year and if so, the details thereof and if not, the reasons therefor?

- i. National Skill Qualification Framework (NSQF).
- ii. Community College Scheme.
- iii. Bachelor of Vocational Education (B.Voc).
- iv. Carrier Oriented Course (COC).
- v. Kaushal Kendra.
- vi. Employability Enhancement Training Programme (EETP).
- vii. National Employability Enhancement Mission (NEEM).

(c): The details of vocational courses are being taught in B.Voc courses and Community College is at Annexure.

(e): The impact of vocational courses introduced through Ministry of Human Resource Development during the last one year has not been studied. However, as per information provided by the Universities/College during XI Plan period, 3, 15,821 students were admitted under Career Oriented Courses in different Universities/Colleges and 50,109 students got Placement/Employment through Colleges/Institutions.
