- (a) whether the Government has any proposal to introduce vocational training in Government-aided and registered private schools in some States in the country;

- (e) whether there is any proposal to set up industry advisory boards at the State level to improve the level of vocational studies in schools; and

- (a) to (d): Yes Madam. Under the component of Vocationalisation of Secondary and Higher Secondary Education of Rashtriya Madhyamik Shiksha Abhiyan there is a provision for performance linked incentive to the tune of Rs. 6500/- per child to government aided and recognized, unaided private schools on successful completion of two levels of the course by the students in accordance with the norms of the scheme and laid down standards. The scheme is applicable throughout the country.
- (e): Under the component of Vocationalisation of Secondary and Higher Secondary Education of Rashtriya Madhyamik Shiksha Abhiyan scheme, there is no provision to set up industry advisory boards at the State level.
