- (b) whether MoHUPA proposed to focus on an affordable housing policy that includes a rental housing interventions programme and if so, the facts thereof;
- (c) whether rental housing offers a convenient and cost-effective option for all migrant populations that might not want to make long-term financial commitment in a city and if so, the facts thereof; and
- (d) whether the Government proposes the National Rental Housing Policy to enable the growth of rental housing in a holistic manner and if so, the facts thereof?

(a): As per Census 2011, 27% of the urban households live in rental housing. As per the National Sample Survey Organisation's 65th round Report on Housing Conditions

and Amenities in India (2008-09), 30 percent of the urban households are living on hired dwelling out of which 25% are informal and 5% are formal.

(b) to (d): "Land" and "Colonisation" are State subjects and therefore, it is the primary responsibility of State Governments and Urban Local Bodies to provide housing including rental housing. In order to supplement the efforts of State Governments, this Ministry has prepared a draft Model Tenancy Act and has shared the same with the States.
