- (d) whether there is any proposal to set up new shipyards and if so, the details thereof including estimated funds required for the purpose?

STATEMENT REFERRED TO IN REPLY TO PARTS (a) TO (d) OF THE LOK SABHA STARRED QUESTION NO.584 TO BE ANSWERED ON 7TH MAY, 2015 RAISED BY SHRI ELUMALAI V. AND DR. RATNA DE (NAG) REGARDING 'MODERNISATION /ESTABLISHMENT OF SHIPYARDS'

(a) There are 8 public sector and about 20 private sector shipyards in India. Out of the 8 public sector shipyards, 2 are under the administrative control of the Ministry of Shipping, 4 are under the administrative control of the Ministry of Defence and the remaining 2 are under the administrative control of the State Governments of Gujarat and West Bengal. The details of the shipyards are at Annexure-I.

(b) The revenue earned by each of the Central Public Sector shipyards in the country during the last three years is given at Annexure-II.

(c) The Government of India is committed to the growth of Shipbuilding industry in India. Promotion of shipbuilding industry is a key component of the 'Make in India' initiative ` of the government. The details of the modernisation and expansion programme of the Central Public Sector shipyards are at Annexure-III.
