However, some of the State Governments and private entities have set up institutions exclusively for girls, the details of which, as provided by the respective Councils, namely, the Medical Council of India, the Dental Council of India, the Nursing Council and the Pharmacy Council of India, are given below:

- (ii) "Establishment of New Medical Colleges attached with District/ Referral hospitals"; and
- (iii) "Up-gradation of existing State Government/Central Government medical colleges to increase MBBS seats in the country";
- (iv) Setting up of GNM Schools.
