**Will the Minister of PLANNING be pleased to state:**

- (a) whether most of the States have shown continuous growth during each of the last three years ;
- (b) if so, the details thereof, State/UT-wise including Karnataka;
- (c) the average annual growth of States as against the national average during each of the last three years, State/UT-wise;
- (d) whether any States have registered declining growth during the above period; and
- (e) if so, the details thereof and corrective measures taken by the Government in this regard?

**Answer**

(a) to (e): Based on the latest information on growth rate of Gross State Domestic Product (GSDP) at constant 2004-05 prices available from the Central Statistics Office of the Ministry of Planning and Programme Implementation, the details of the State/ UT-wise growth rate of GSDP including that of Karnataka from 2011-12 to 2013-14 and the average annual growth rate of States/ UTs as against the national average during this period are at Annexure. The State of Arunachal Pradesh and Uttar Pradesh have registered declining growth rate of GSDP during the period 2011-12 to 2013-14.

The growth in GSDP depends on several factors including rate of savings and investments in the State, growth in productivity, business climate, human development, state of infrastructure and State Government efforts. The Central Government also supplements the State Government's efforts through transfer of resources by way of various schemes.
