- (c) Ministry under its Biosphere Reserve Program, a Centrally Sponsored Scheme, provides funds for implementation of Management Action Plans submitted by the concerned State Governments. The items of intervention for management include value addition activities, rehabilitation of landscapes of threatened species and eco-systems, Socio-economic upliftment of local communities, maintenance and protection of corridor areas and development of eco-tourism.

Nilgiri Biosphere Reserve, one of the most important bio-diversity centres in the country, is located in the tri-junctional area of Tamil Nadu, Kerala and Karnataka States. For implementation of Management Action Plans in Nilgiri Biosphere Reserve, the Ministry has provided financial assistance of about Rs.273.48 lakh during the last three years.
