Will the Minister of SOCIAL JUSTICE AND EMPOWERMENT be pleased to state:

(a) whether the Government has identified Scheduled Castes dominated areas in the country and if so, the details thereof, State-wise;

(b) whether there is any plan/scheme to provide education, health, drinking water, electricity and other basic facilities to people living in these areas; and

(c) if so, the details thereof along with the projects being implemented in this regard, State-wise and if not, the reasons therefor?

Answer

(a) As per Census 2011, there are 46,844 villages in the country having greater than 50 % SC population. The State wise number of such villages is placed at Annexure.

(b) & (c) (i)A Centrally-Sponsored Pilot Scheme of Pradhan Mantri Adarsh Gram Yojana (PMAGY), approved by the Government in 2010, is being implemented in five States selected from 5 regions of the country as follows, for integrated development of 1000 Scheduled Castes (SCs)-majority villages :-

S.No. Region State No. of selected villages
1 North Himachal Pradesh 225
2 East Bihar 225
3 West Rajasthan 225
4 South Tamil Nadu 225
5 North-East Assam 100

(ii) The objective of the Scheme is to ensure integrated development of the selected villages through provision of requisite physical (eg safe drinking water, electricity, roads, housing, sanitary toilets) and social (eg. school, health care centre, aanganwadi, panchayat etc) infrastructure.

(iii) The Scheme aims at the integrated development of selected villages primarily, through (a) convergent implementation of the existing Central and State Schemes, and (b) through 'Gap-filling' in the form of Central Assistance @ Rs. 20 lakh per village on an average (with the States expected to provide a matching contribution), for meeting such requirements of the selected villages as cannot be met through convergent implementation of the Central and State Schemes.
