## Will the Minister of AYURVEDA, YOGA & NATUROPATHY, UNANI, SIDDHA AND HOMEOPATHY (AYUSH) be pleased to state:

Will the Minister of AYURVEDA, YOGA & NATUROPATHY, UNANI, SIDDHA AND HOMOEOPATHY (AYUSH) be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the department of AYUSH has entered into an agreement with World Health Organisation in the field of traditional medicines:
- (b) if so, the details thereof including likely expenditure to be incurred and the funding pattern agreed upon for the said collaboration;
- (c) the extent by which the said collaboration is likely to promote acceptability of traditional Indian medicines internationally and the time-frame of its implementation; and
- (d) the other steps taken/being taken by the Government for overall promotion of AYUSH system of medicines both domestically and internationally?

## **Answer**

THE MINISTER OF STATE (IC) OF THE MINISTRY OF AYURVEDA, YOGA & NATUROPATHY, UNANI, SIDDHA AND HOMOEOPATHY (SHRI SHRIPAD YESSO NAIK)

- (a) to (c): The Union Cabinet in its meeting held on 17.02.2016 approved the signing of Agreement with the World Health Organisation (WHO). The Agreement, however, is yet to be signed. As per the Cabinet approval, as a first step in the long term collaboration, India would assign to WHO activities for development of the following WHO Technical documents/publications which will help in better international/domstic acceptability of Indian Systems of Medicine:
- i) Benchmarks for training in Yoga
- ii) Benchmarks for practice in Ayurveda
- iii) Benchmarks for practice in Unani Medicine
- iv) Benchmarks for practice in Panchakarma

As per the approval of the Cabinet, the estimated expenditure to be incurred amounts to US \$977,040. The outgo will be in four instalments. First to be paid within two months after the agreement is signed (US\$ 123,170); second by the end of July 2016 (US \$ 210,180); third by the end of July 2017 (US \$ 151,420) and the fourth by the end of July 2018 (USD \$ 202,270). The balance amount of US \$ 290,000 would be spent in India.
