(a) whether the Food Corporation of India has estimated the economic cost of wheat and rice for the year 2013-14;

(b) if so, the details thereof indicating the estimated cost per quintal and the amount by which it is greater than that in the year 2009-2010;

(c) the details of items of expenditure covered at the time of estimating the said cost; and

(d) the amount of funds spent per quintal on each of the said items during the years 2009-2010 and 2012-2013?

(a): Yes Madam.

(b): The estimated economic cost of wheat and rice per quintal for the year 2013-14 (RE), 2009-10 and per quintal increase over 2009-10 is given as under:

Economic cost 2013-14 (RE) 2009-10 Increase over 2009-10
Wheat 1932.39 1424.61 507.78
Rice 2648.54 1820.07 828.47
```

(c): Economic cost consists of acquisition cost (i.e. average Minimum Support Price (MSP) + procurement incidentals) and distribution cost.

The procurement incidentals are expenses which are incurred from procurement point till the first storage point and include the following:

- 1. Statutory/obligatory cost.
- 2. Labour & transportation charges.
- 3. Storage & interest charges.
- 4. Other Expenses.

The elements which are part of the Distribution Cost are as under:

1. Freight

- 2. Handling charges
- 3. Storage charges
- 4. Interest
- 5. Transit shortages
- 6. Storage shortages

7 Administrative overheads

(d): The amount of funds spent per quintal of wheat and rice during the year 2009-10 and 2012-13 is given at Annexure-I & II respectively.
