- (a) to (d): The Medical Council of India (MCI) is the statutory body responsible for establishing and maintaining high standards in medical education. For this purpose MCI causes the assessment of every medical college on a year to year basis. As per the Medical Council of India's Establishment of Medical College Regulations, 1999, the following organizations shall be eligible to apply for permission to set up new medical colleges:-
- I. A University and State Governments/Union territories;
- II. An autonomous body promoted by Central and State Government by or under a Statute for the purpose of medical education;
- III. A society registered under the Societies Registration Act, 1860 (21 of 1860) or corresponding Acts in States; or
- IV. A public religious or charitable trust registered under the Trust Act, 1882 (2 of 1882) or the WAKFS Act, 1954 (29 of 1954).
- V. Companies registered under Company Act may also be allowed to open medical colleges. Permission shall be withdrawn if the colleges resort to commercialization.

Further to improve the standard of medical education in the country, a common Entrance Test namely National Eligibility cum Entrance Test (NEET) has been introduced from the academic year 2016-17, for admissions to undergraduate and post graduate courses.
