## Will the Minister of DRINKING WATER AND SANITATION be pleased to state:

- (a) the number of toilets constructed during each of the last two years and the current year under Swachh Bharat Mission(SBM)-Gramin, State/UT-wise;
- (b) the percentage of these newly constructed toilets which are fully functional and attached to sewage lines;
- (c) the percentage of these newly constructed toilets which are actually inuse/operational;
- (d) the number of villages that have been declared "open defecation-free", State/UT-wise; and
- (e) whether the usage of toilets has been increased in rural areas during the said period and if so, the details thereof and if not, the reasons therefor?

## **Answer**

## MINISTER OF STATE FOR MINISTRY OF DRINKING WATER & SANITATION (SHRI RAMESH CHANDAPPA JIGAJINAGI)

- (a)State/UT-wise, Individual household latrines (IHHLs) constructed underSwachh Bharat Mission (Gramin) (SBM(G)) during each of the last two years and thecurrent year, as per the information uploaded by the States/UTs on the online Integrated Management Information System(IMIS) of SBM(G) is at Annexure-1.
- (b) and (c) The National Sample Survey Office conducted a Survey in 2015 (published as Swachhta Status Report, 2016), as per which, out of the households having sanitary toilets, 95.6% people were found to be using the same. Under SBM(G), most of the toilets use on-site disposal technology (such as twin leach pit toilets) and do not require connection with sewage lines for safe disposal of faeces.
- (d) State/UT-wise, number of villages that have been declared "open defecation-free" as per the information uploaded by the States/UTs on the online Integrated Management Information System (IMIS) of SBM(G) is at Annexure-2.
- (e) Yes, Madam. The focus of Swachh Bharat Mission (Gramin) is on behaviour change of people to adopt safe sanitation and use toilet. As per the baseline survey conducted in 2012-13, the percentage of functional toilets was only 79.42%. The Swachhta Status Report, 2016 indicates increase in usage.
