## Will the Minister of RURAL DEVELOPMENT be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the Government is providing training to unemployed persons in rural areas for providing them job;
- (b) if so, the details thereof and the nature of vocations in which the training is being given;
- (c) the number of persons who have been trained so far and the number of them got employment and the expenditure incurred thereon, State/UT-wise; and
- (d) the details of programmes or schemes chalked out for giving them employment after completion of the training?

## **Answer**

MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF RURAL DEVELOPMENT (SHRI RAM KRIPAL YADAV)

- (a): Yes, Madam.
- (b): Ministry of Rural Development is undertaking two initiatives in skill development training for unemployed persons in rural areas under the National Rural Livelihoods Mission (NRLM) as follows:-
- (i) Deen Dayal Upadhyaya Grameen Kaushalya Yojana (DDU-GKY), a placement linked skill development program which allows skilling in a PPP mode and assured placements in regular jobs in an organization not owned by the skilled person. DDU-GKY allows skill training in 329 job roles with certification under National Council for Vocational Training / Sector Skills Council or courses aligned with National Skill Qualification Framework.
- (ii) Skill development through Rural Self Employment and Training Institutes (RSETI), which provides skilling, thereby enabling the trainee to take bank credit and start his/her own Micro-enterprise. Some of such trainees may also seek regular salaried jobs. Under RSETI training is available in 334 job roles which inter-alia leads to entrepreneurship and self employment.
- (c): The number of persons trained and placed under DDU-GKY State/UT-wise during the year 2016-17 (till December 2016) is given below:-
