- (c) whether there are still shortcomings in the provision of passenger facilities at the airports and also in the planes of the Government airlines, if so, the details thereof:
- (d) whether the merger of the two State-owned airlines in 2011 has resulted in the loss of thousands of crores of rupees to the national exchequer; and
- (e) if so, the details thereof and the steps taken by the Government on inquiry in the matter along with the outcome thereof?

- (v) High Airport user charges
- (vi) Adverse Impact of exchange rate variation due to weakening of the Indian Rupee.
