- (d) if so, the details and guidelines issued thereof?

(a) to (d): The Government has issued guidelines on fair trade practices related to charging of service charge from consumers by hotels/restaurants. As per these guidelines, the bills presented to customers may clearly display that service charge is voluntary and the service charge column of the bill may be left blank for the customer to fill up before making payment.
