(a) whether some private schools of the country are running separate classes for Economically Weaker Sections (EWS) category students which is in violation to the Right to Education Act (RTE);

(b) if so, the number of incidents of discrimination and biased attitude that came to light in various States including Rajasthan during the last two years and the current year; and

(c) the mechanism existing with the Government for ensuring strict compliance of guidelines under RTE?

(a) & (b): No such incident has been reported by the State Governments including Rajasthan.

(c): Complaints on non-compliance of the provisions of the Right of Children to Free and Compulsory Education (RTE) Act, 2009 are immediately referred by the Central Government to the concerned State/UT for remedial action. In addition, local grievance redressal mechanisms by State Governments and the setting of a State Commission for Protection of Child Right (SCPCR) at State level and the National Commission for Protection of Child Right (NCPCR) at national level, also redress grievances with regard to the implementation of the RTE Act.
