- (a) whether Air India has been spending a major portion of its revenue on cabin crew layover accommodation across its operational network;
- (b) if so, the details of the amount spent by Air India for this purpose during the last three years and the current year;
- (c) whether Air India is planning to take serviced apartments on lease basis to provide layover accommodation to its cabin crew staff instead of five-star hotels so as to reduce its expenditure burden; and
- (d) if so, the details thereof?

Answer

Minister of State in the Ministry of CIVIL AVIATION (Dr. Mahesh Sharma)

- (a): No, Madam. Around 1% of the total revenue is spent on the Crew layover accommodation (including Cockpit Crew) across Air India operational network.
- (b): Details of expense on crew Hotel accommodation (including Cockpit Crew) are as follows-
