SHORTAGE OF DOCTORS IN ESI HOSPITALS

Will the Minister of LABOUR AND EMPLOYMENT be pleased to state:

(a)the total number of medical and paramedical staff working on contractual basis in Employees State Insurance (ESI) hospitals, State-wise;

(b)whether there is a shortage of doctors including specialists/super-specialists, medical and para-medical staff in such hospitals under ESIC in various States including Mangalore in Karnataka; and

(c)if so, the total number of posts sanctioned, in position and existing vacancies of the said categories of medical and para-medical staff in these hospitals under ESIC including Mangalore in Karnataka and the reasons for the shortfall and the steps taken to fill up the vacancies, State/UT-wise?

Answer

MINISTER OF STATE (IC) FOR LABOUR AND EMPLOYMENT (SHRI BANDARU DATTATREYA)

- (a): Total number of Medical and Para-Medical staff working on direct contract in Employees' State Insurance Corporation (ESIC) hospitals is 309. State-Wise/Hospital-wise details are at Annex.
- (b) & (c): Yes, Madam. The details of posts sanctioned, in-position and existing vacancies of doctors & para-medical staff at ESIC Hospitals are as under:

Medical Nursing & Para-Medical Sanctioned 2571 12487 In-Position 1715 8346 Vacancy 856 4141

The reasons for shortfall of doctors/specialists include:

- a. There is general shortage of Doctors particularly the specialists in the country.
- b. Some Doctors/Specialists do not apply for the job as private practice is not allowed in ESIC.
- c. Doctors leave the job for better opportunity outside ESIC or for pursuing higher studies.

Filling-up the vacancies is an on-going process. However, the steps taken/being taken to fill up vacancies under ESIC are as under:

- a. 40% of the sanctioned posts under the General Duty Medical Officer (GDMO) sub-cadre in ESIC hospitals are being filled with Senior Residents by Medical Superintendents locally.
- b. In addition, 10 Senior Residents posts per 100 beds have also been sanctioned over and above the sanctioned post of GDMOs. These are also filled by Medical Superintendent locally.
- c. The Medical Superintendent have been authorised to recruit super specialists and specialists on contract basis till the regular incumbents become available.
- d. Regular recruitment process has been/is being initiated to fill up vacant post in ESIC hospitals.

ESI Hospital, Mangalore is under the control of ESI (Medical Services) Govt. of Karnataka. The details of post sanctioned, in-position and existing vacancies of doctors and para-medical staff at ESIS Hospital, Mangalore are as under:

In addition, 10 specialists are working at ESIS, Mangalore Hospital on contract.
