- a) & e) Strategy of the Department of Animal Husbandry, Dairying & Fisheries, Ministry of Agriculture to conserve and develop indigenous breeds (including Kherigarh, Dangi and Gir breed of cattle and Surti breed of buffalo) as reflected in National Livestock Policy, 2013 and Rashtriya Gokul Mission comprises the following main components:
- (i) Production of high genetic merit (HGM) bulls of indigenous breeds though pedigree selection and progeny testing.
- (ii) Induction of HGM and disease free bulls of indigenous breeds at semen stations and for natural service.
- (iii) Extension of Artificial Insemination (AI) coverage.
- (iv) Strengthening of bull mother farms.
- (b) There are 37 registered breeds of cows in the country.
- (c) List of Universities and Research Centres engaged in improving the breed of Livestock/cows and developing new breeds is Annexed.
- (d) Department of Animal Husbandry Dairying & Fisheries has not provided any assistance to the corporate houses for the said purpose.
